

## **Matthew W. Hamill – Biography**

**Matthew W. Hamill** is Senior Vice President of the National Association of College and University Business Officers (NACUBO). He joined the staff in December 2003, where he oversees the association's policy, research, communications and public relations activities. NACUBO represents chief administrative and financial officers at 2,000 colleges and universities across the country. NACUBO's mission is to promote sound management and financial practices at colleges and universities.

Before joining NACUBO, Hamill served for more than three years as a Senior Associate at The Institute for Higher Education Policy. At the Institute, Hamill consulted with numerous higher education institutions and other nonprofit organizations, and continued his focus on tax policy issues that impact nonprofit organizations, including institutions of higher education, their students, and employees.

Prior to joining the Institute, Hamill served as Vice President for Public Policy for INDEPENDENT SECTOR. INDEPENDENT SECTOR's public policy effort focuses on issues that impact and interest nonprofit organizations, with a special emphasis on tax policies and accountability practices that shape the nonprofit sector. From 1991 to 1997, Hamill served as Vice President for Administration for the National Association of Independent Colleges and Universities (NAICU), a 900-member trade association representing private, non-profit colleges and universities. In this position, he served as chief of staff as well as the association's representative on tax issues affecting independent colleges and universities, their students, faculties, and employees.

Before his service at NAICU, Hamill served on the staff of Representative Robert T. Matsui (D-CA) from 1987-91, as legislative assistant and legislative director specializing in federal tax issues. From 1983-87 he was the district representative for Representative Matthew F. McHugh (D-N.Y.), working out of his Ithaca, New York office. Hamill received his bachelor's degree from Amherst College.
